Which NHS service to choose when you're ill

Choosing well ensures you receive the right care at the right time and that emergency medical care is available to those people who need it the most.

Keep well by choosing well

If you become ill or injured and need medical help or advice, choose well by using the right NHS service for your needs.

The options open to you are given on the right.

Examples are:

- **A&E or 999:** choking, chest pain or blacking out
- **Minor Injuries Unit:** cuts and strains
- **GP (including GP doctors, dentists, opticians):** ongoing vomiting, backache, long term problems
- **Pharmacist:** diarrhoea, painful cough, headache
- **NHS 111:** unsure or unwell?
- **Self-care:** hangover, sore throat, cough

All the practices which make up west Somerset have come together to improve health services locally.

The practices are: **Dunster Surgery**, **Exmoor Medical Centre** (Dulverton), **Harley House Surgery** (Minehead), **Irnham Lodge Surgery** (Minehead), **Porlock Medical Centre** and **West Somerset Healthcare** (Williton and Watchet).



Minor Injury Units



The minor injuries service runs across the county in many of the local community hospitals. If you have an injury, if you think something is broken and may need an xray, or your GP advises you to attend then an MIU (Minor Injury Unit) is for you.

There are MIUs at Minehead, and at Tiverton (and Bridgwater, Burnham on Sea, Frome, Glastonbury, Shepton Mallet and Chard too!). They are all run by Emergency Nurse Practitioners (ENPs) with Staff Nurses and Health Care Assistants in support.

What we do

We see everyone who attends with whatever they attend with – we hope to be able to do everything needed in one go and discharge you home – however if we are not able to do this we will refer you on to the right service for definitive care.

MIU staff can:

- stitch cuts
- remove things from ears, noses etc
- remove splinters
- dress minor wounds, cuts and grazes
- apply plaster casts
- provide screening and treatment for Chlamydia
- and treat:
 - sprains and strains
 - minor broken bones
 - minor burns and scalds
 - minor head injuries
 - insect and animal bites
 - minor eye injuries
 - other minor injuries



What do I do if I need a GP when my surgery is closed?

In Somerset an out-of-hours service provides GPs for medical care needed before your GP surgery is next open, **6.30pm to 08.00am weekdays and all day weekends and bank holidays.**

It is not intended to provide

routine care that should be accessed during normal surgery hours.

If you need some advice but your problem or query is not serious you can also call NHS 111 or log on to www.nhsdirect.nhs.uk.

Annual Flu Jabs

Flu can be really unpleasant, but if you are otherwise healthy it will usually clear up on its own within a week or two. However, flu can be more severe in certain people, such as:

- anyone aged 65 and over
- pregnant women
- anyone with an underlying health condition
- people with weakened immune systems

These risk groups are more likely to develop potentially serious complications of flu, such as pneumonia (a lung infection), so it's recommended that they have a flu vaccine every year to protect them.

Your GP surgery will identify everyone in these groups, and will offer everyone eligible a free annual flu injection.

Get confident in self care

It will help to keep a basic stock of medicines at home such as:

- Paracetamol or aspirin
- Antidiarrhoeal medicine and a rehydration mixture
- Indigestion remedy
- Plasters and a thermometer

Also, you could try using www.nhsdirect.nhs.uk online or NHS 111 on the phone - they have symptom checkers and comprehensive information to help.



When should I visit A&E?

A&E departments assess and treat patients with serious injuries or illnesses.

You should only visit A&E or call 999 for life threatening emergencies such as:

- Loss of consciousness
- Acute confused state
- Fits that are not stopping
- Persistent, severe chest pain
- Breathing difficulties
- Severe bleeding that can't be stopped

If an ambulance is needed, call 999.

Our local 24 hour A&E service is **Musgrove Park Hospital, Taunton.**

Please remember, if you use A&E for illnesses or injuries that are not severe, this may mean a long wait for you as well as keeping the doctors and nurses away from the more severe cases that really do need their help.




The **dental helpline** is a service designed to offer dental advice and/or appointments for either emergency or urgent dental treatment, such as;

- Severe dental and facial pain not controlled by over-the-counter pain killers
- Significant dental and soft tissue acute infection
- Injuries to the teeth or jaw
- Rapidly increasing swelling around the throat or eye
- Uncontrollable bleeding after an extraction
